What parents need to know is that a vaccine may be very effective at preventing kids from changing into so sick from flu that there are life-threatening complications, like Jade did. A 2014 research showed that flu vaccine lowered a child's danger of being admitted to the pediatric intensive care unit by 74%. A 2017 examine showed the vaccine also significantly reduced a child's danger of dying from the flu,
