- What is the necessity of keeping our surroundings clean ?

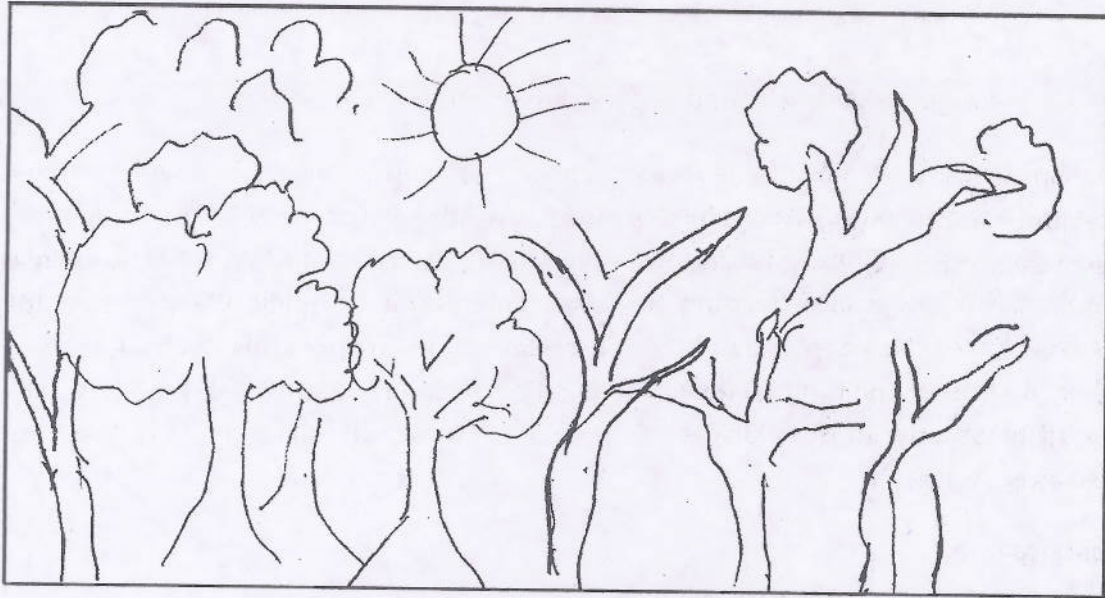
